TO THE HONOURABLE,

THE MINISTER OF HIGHWAYS,

FOR THE PROVINCE OF SASKATCHEWAN.

THE PETITION of the undersigned RATEPAYERS of the Village of Saskatchewan Beach, OWNERS OF PROPERTY in the said Village and neighborhood adjacent thereto, and PERSONS RESIDING and DWELLING in and near the said Village HUMBLY SHEWETH:-

WHEREAS the Village of Saskatchewan Beach was formed in 1919, and until 1922 there was no public roadway entering the said Village. In 1922 the Counsel purchased from Elizabeth Benjafield a strip of land for the purpose of a roadway continuing from the Government road allowance between the North-West quarter of 19 - 21 - 21 West of the Second Meridian, and the North-east of 24 - 21 - 22 West of the Second Meridian, and the said strip of land was duly registered as a road in the Regins Land Titles Office in Plan C. L. 2935.

AND WHEREAS the said strip of land in its present condition is unfit and dangerous for vehicular traffic and as a result all vehicular traffic now entering the said Village from the said Government road is compelled to trespass upon and does trespass upon a portion of the farm lands of the said Elizabeth Benjafield.

AND WHEREAS since the said Village was formed in 1919 it has paid to the Government of this Province in Public Revenue taxes the sum of \$1185.00, and still continues to annually contribute taxes to the public revenue.

WHEREFORE, your said Petitioners, therefore humbly request that the Government of this Province having regard to the summer season being imminent, does, with all possible despatch, all things necessary to convert the said strip of land into a permanent, safe and suitable road for vehicular traffic.
